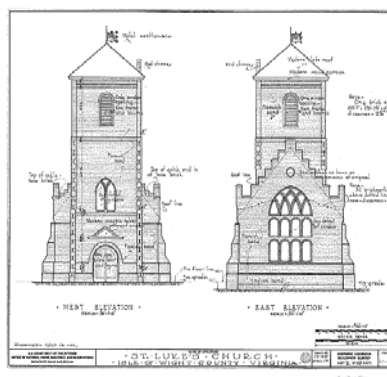
## Welcome to the Board

## Christmas Open House

## The Restoration Begins

The long anticipated repair on **Historic St. Luke's Church** began this spring with preliminary work on the exterior of the building. Lichen covered large surfaces of the outside brick and tests needed to be conducted to determine a safe way to remove it from our centuries old brick and mortar. Organic biocide was lightly applied in a test patch and after it was determined that the solution caused no damage, the **Virginia Department of Historic Resources** approved its use on the church.

Additionally, because St. Luke's has a perpetual preservation easement, we were required to call in archaeologist **Nick Locketti** to perform ground testing prior to starting work on the new drainage system. Nick and his crew from **The James River Institute for Archaeology** hand dug trenches around three sides of the church where the drainage pipes were expected to be placed. Although surrounded by grave sites, the new trenches did not extend deep enough to disturb any graves but did uncover evidence of eighteen different features (burial sites). Once these two stages of work were completed and approved by **VDHR** and the **National Park Service** (which administers our **Save America's Treasures** grant) the construction phase started.

Relocating the external electrical wires and water pipes to the inside of the bell tower was the first step in the construction phase. While no one wants to see these fixtures on a historic building, they are necessary to maintain a museum type air-conditioning and humidification system needed to protect Historic St. Luke's priceless artifacts.

As we write this, steel beams are being installed to reinforce the bell tower's roof. Brick masons are in line to begin replacing deteriorating bricks with custom made ones and repointing mortar made from a historic formula containing oyster shells and sand.

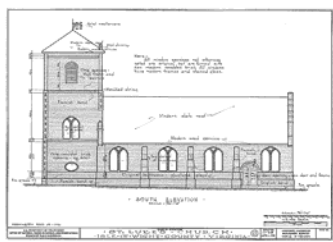

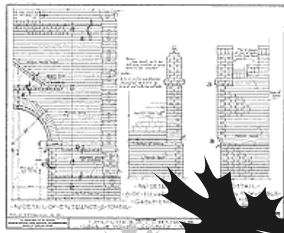

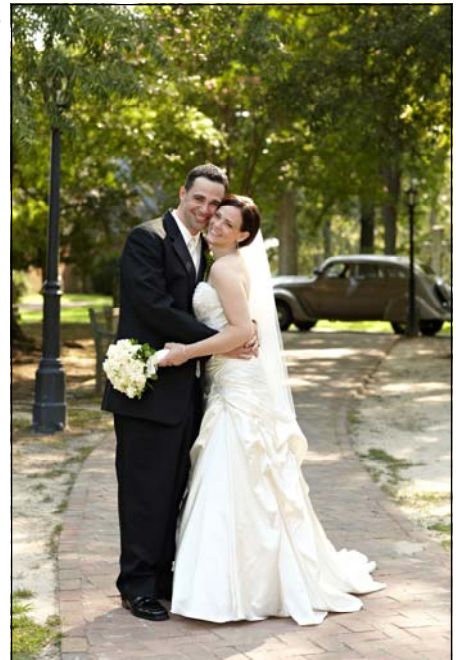
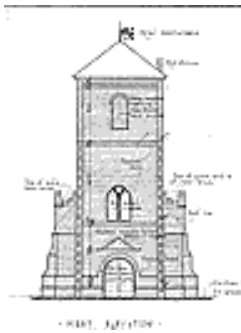

## Annual Report from the President October, 2011

The past 12 months have been challenging for Historic St. Luke's Restoration. We have experienced all the routine problems associated with managing this historic property, including the usual mechanical and equipment failures, weather-related issues including a hurricane, and, most prominently, the necessity of jump starting the church repairs that have been on the books for several years.

As the year concludes, I am pleased to report that the Board and staff have met these challenges and more, and that considerable progress has been made on several fronts, a summary of which includes:

**The Repair Project:** As the Restoration year began last November, we were faced with the reality that only about 18 months remained for us to hire architects, design the repair work, name a contractor and have the work accomplished. Without aggressive action, we stood to lose \$250,000 in matching federal grant money. Thanks to the work of the Executive Director, her Assistant Director, the Building and Grounds Committee, and especially Board member Lawrence Pitt, we were able to decisively move ahead with the project. As the year draws to an end, we remain under an extraordinarily tight schedule, which will have to be managed aggressively if the work is to be completed by the grant deadline of March of 2012. I am convinced that we will succeed.

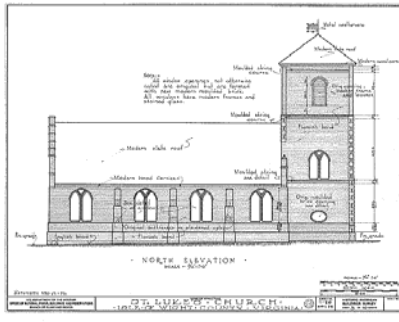
**Fund raising:** For half a decade, the Board has talked about and wrestled with the need to raise a significant amount of money to undertake additional work on the environs of St. Luke's, including an erosion control project that was outlined by engineer Roger Pope four years ago. In recent months, the Development Committee, under the capable leadership of Maynard Gwaltney, has renewed planning for a fund drive. The Executive Director will be organizing and managing the effort and we expect to see a drive fully fleshed out and ready to launch within six months.

**Outreach:** Historic St. Luke's has recognized a need to reach a broader audience within our community and beyond, and the restoration's Program Committee, chaired by Mary Cole, has made strides in that direction. Four notable events — a

salute to Bach, an Easter egg hunt on the grounds, a performance by the Virginia Children's Choir and a rousing and emotional performance by the combined Main Street Baptist Church Choir, have opened our doors to segments of the community who had little earlier connection with St. Luke's

**Marketing:** An ad hoc Marketing Committee chaired by Brian Pack of Smithfield Station provided new ideas and fresh perspective on time-tested approaches early this year. While I believe our marketing effort will always be a work in progress, we have made a start and it has had a favorable impact on our numbers this year.

**Visitation:** With vigorous support from the Isle of Wight Convention and Visitors Bureau, St. Luke's has become a



more integral part of the Isle of Wight experience for visitors. During 2010 St. Luke's experienced an increase in visitor numbers during 10 out of 12 months, and thus far in 2011, we have shown an increase during 7 out of 9 months reported. The increase, so far this year, is 22 percent. It's a trend that we fully expect to continue.

**Cemetery:** A project to computerize the Memorial Park cemetery records was largely completed this year under the leadership of Alan Monette. While the software input remains incomplete, the project is well on its way to providing ongoing updates of lot ownership and other information valuable to the Restoration.

**Finances:** The Finance Committee has provided the Restoration with sound, conservative advice throughout the year. A change in our investment approach as well

as an investigation of a tax credit program that could reap benefits to St. Luke's has been the result. The Executive Director has maintained tight control of the corporation's finances, giving the Board an ever-increasing confidence in our management of assets.

**Governance:** We have attempted to streamline the business of St. Luke's to the extent possible and at the same time increase board awareness and participation. By allowing e-mail votes on new board member applications, we have been able to bring on board talented new members more quickly, to the benefit of the Restoration. Board members are kept apprised electronically of major events at St. Luke's between board meetings and that approach will be expanded during the coming year.

The Restoration has a dedicated staff and an energized and talented Board of Directors. The staff has embraced change during the past 12 months with a "can do" attitude that has made our challenges less daunting. The directors have been engaged and willing to work. They have been supportive of the staff and myself, while willing to question anything that, in their view, might be detrimental to the wellbeing of St. Luke's. They have volunteered to serve on committees and have taken their assignments seriously. This year's success is directly due to the positive attitude and collective efforts of the Board and staff.

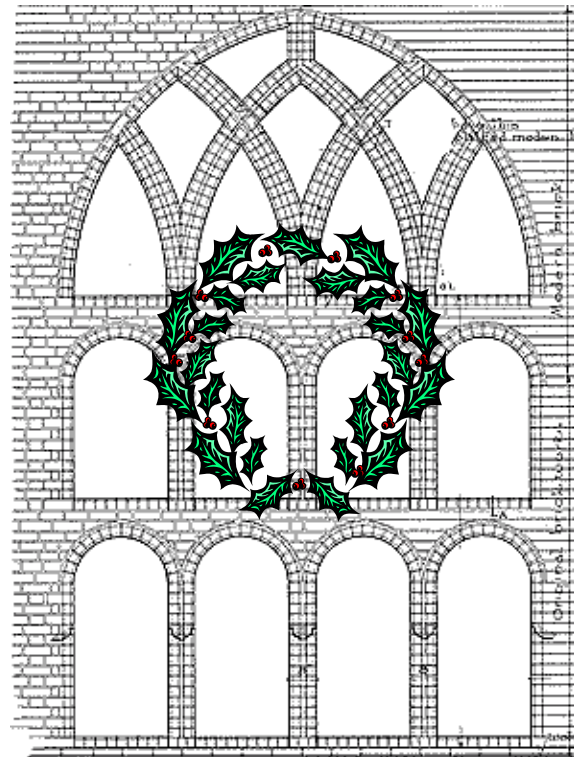
